## **55.DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

### **56.APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

To approve the minutes as a correct record of the meeting held on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> August 2010.

Under Item 44 the Spelling of Mr Childs name was corrected.

Under item 49 the spelling of Mr Tidey name was corrected

It was proposed by Mr R Harris and seconded by Mr R Manders that the Minutes were approved and signed.

### **57.PUBLIC DISCUSSION**

Mrs Thursa Crocker raised concerns that cars were still parking on the beach. Mrs J Townsend informed her that people who work and live in the village can buy permits for £200 per year. She also apologised for Mrs Murray's absence, but she was at the chapel sale.

Mr T Childs informed the Parish Council that at the last meeting he was talking about the rubbish problem at the bottom of the village and the need for more bins. The next day one of the three bins was removed. He informed the council that he would be interested to hear what was said under item 13 on the agenda.

He felt that the bottom of the village could now go towards access only for locals and businesses, as they are still getting cars coming through. He informed the council that he had met a man from Scotland who had got a ticket from parking on the beach.

Mr E Fletcher informed the council that he would like to see a residents parking scheme in Hartland Road, Hilsons Close, Mayfield and Silvershell Roads.

a) It was resolved that the financial statement be approved and cheques for payment were signed

### **59.PLANNING APPLICATIONS AND NOTICES**

Approvals & Refusals

Application PA10/03457 Single Storey rear extension and general refurbishment. Mr Andrew Garrard, 16 The Terrace, Port Isaac. Cornwall Council APPROVED this application.

Application 2010/0715 Construction of farm managers dwelling. RD, K J & DRW Harris, Tolraggott Farm, St Endellion, Port Isaac. Cornwall Council APPROVED this application.

Application 2010/00733 Creation of a 135 space car park and junction. St Endellion Parish Council, St Endellion Playing field, Port Isaac. Cornwall Council APPROVED this application.

Application 2010/00499 Construction of 8 affordable dwellings, Land Opposite Furze Park, Trelights, Port Isaac. Cornwall Council APPROVED this application.

### **60.CHAIRMANS REPORT**

**Mrs Janet Townsend informed the Council that she did not have a report however would take this opportunity to mention the new car park, which has been full and successful over the summer and everything she had heard has been complimentary.**

Mrs Pomfret felt that the signs on Church Hill were in the wrong place and needed to be clearer.

Mr E Fletcher felt that there needed to be a map on the notice boards and by the car park with information on it such as where Doc Martins cottages is, and how to get to the village.

Mrs Townsend felt that all these items needed to be bought up at the consultation day.

### **61.COMMITTEE REPORTS**

### **Climate Friendly**

Mr Robert Manders informed the Council that Port Isaac can be short listed for the Sustainable Village of the Year Award and they were coming to inspect the village on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> September at 1.30pm and staying for 2 hours. He had written to all the people involved in the application and so far Dee Littlechild was the only person to express an interest in meeting with them.

Mr Manders informed the council that he will draw up a time table with a walk around the village to show it in the best light.

### **Wadebridge/Padstow Community Network**

Mr Manders informed the Council that he had been to a Community Network meeting.

He informed the Council that he had been given a Transport Plan for Cornwall for the next 20 years. The last transport plan had only been a 3 year plan. He felt that it was very difficult to have a plan that goes that far into the future. They need comments by Friday. Mr Manders was given permission by the Parish Council to comment on its behalf.

### **Footpaths**

Mr Manders informed the Parish Council that when he put in the footpaths cutting claim into Cornwall Council, he crossed off a footpath as it does not exist. He had a telephone call from Cornwall Council questioning this. The footpath in question serves no purpose and is 180 meters and goes from the main road to Gypsy Lane.

### **School Buses**

Mrs Pomfret informed the council that 5 children from Trelights catch the bus to school;- 2 to Camelford school and 3 to Wadebridge School. The Clerk informed the Council that she had written to Cornwall Council regarding changing the school bus routes to go into Trelights but had received no reply.

### **Main**

Mr E Fletcher informed the Council that he would like to have a public sub committee meeting in two weeks time. The clerk agreed to minute the meeting and send out agendas.

### **62.SEATS**

a) It was proposed by Mr R Harris that we accept the Kemberton Bench as PC standard. This was seconded by Mr R Manders and carried nem.con.

b) It was proposed by Mr R Manders that we replace the seat at top of Trefreock hill (near to Homer Park). This was seconded by Mr E Fletcher and carried nem.con. Mr E Fletcher suggested that we advertise the vacant spot in Trio, this was agreed.

### **63.QE11 PLAYING FIELDS TRUST**

Proposal from Martin Bell to reconsider the boundary of the QE11 playing fields trust scheme: in the light of additional evidence we should restrict the boundary to the current playing field. This proposal was forwarded to the next agenda.

### **64.RUBBISH**

a) It was proposed by Mrs J Pomfret that we purchase at least 6 new 'gull guards'. This was seconded by Mr R Manders and carried nem.con.

b) It was proposal by Mrs J Townsend that PC searches for a suitable type of temporary bin to be placed on the Platt during peak times (and stored away during the winter months). This was seconded by Mr R Manders.

Mr E Fletcher questions how the parish Council could stop businesses using them for commercial waste.

Mrs J Townsend felt that there was not enough bins.

Mrs J Pomfret suggested getting the bins that look like pouches that sit on lamp posts. The proposal was carried nem.con.

c) Proposal that PC considers offering space in their new car park to Cornwall Council to place extra bulk rubbish bins (please see final paragraphs of forwarded email from David Wrench).

Mr R Harris felt that the Parish Council should not give up its parking spaces to bins.

Mr E Fletcher was also unsure about this proposal.

Mrs Townsend read out the e-mail however it was decided to forward this item to the next agenda.

### **65.YELLOW LINES**

Proposal from Chair that we pursue the yellow lines issue with County Council. This item was forwarded to the next agenda.

### **66.GRASS CUTTING SCHEDULE**

Proposal from Chair that we look again at the grass cutting schedule and ask for quotes from 3 local tradesmen who may be willing to take it on. This item was forwarded to the next agenda.

### **67. CLERK'S CORRESPONDENCE**

- a) Mrs Townsend read a letter from Mrs Webb regarding a accident she had in the public toilets at Port Isaac
- b) Mrs Townsend read a letter from Zoë Baker regarding Dog mess in Port Isaac. Clerk to reply informing her that there are lots of bins and notices, but we cannot control dog owners.
- c) Mrs Townsend read a letter from Cornwall Council regarding Winter Services. The letter informed the council that Cornwall Council would continue to fill existing salt bins but will not provide new bins, however, the Parish Council can buy them at cost price if extra bins are needed.
