<b>186</b>	<b>DECLARATION OF INTEREST</b> <b>Mr Martin Bell and Mr David Philp declared an interest in application PA13/00745.</b>	
<b>187</b>	<b>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</b> <b>To approve the minutes as a correct record of the meeting held on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2013</b> <b>The following amendment was made to item 169 at Mr Fletcher's request.</b>  <i>The Chairman also criticised Mr Lee's Letter.</i> <i>Cllr E Fletcher pointed out to the Chairman that the council had had the right to reply to Mr Lee's letter and that such reply was in fact in the Trio with his name and the Vice Chairman's names on the bottom. He was also of the opinion that Cllr Bell had in fact written the report and against the agreement of the council handed it directly to the Trio instead of going through himself. He also expressed the opinion that Mr Lee's statement had in calling the new car park a debacle only gone halfway to the truth and that if the council had been a business it would have gone bust by now.</i>  It was proposed by M Bell and seconded by Mrs J Townsend that the Minutes were approved and signed.  <b>To approve the minutes as a correct record of the meeting held on Monday 25th February 2013</b>  The following amendment was made to item 178. Shop was changed to shape  It was proposed by Mr D Philp and seconded by Mr M Coles that the Minutes were approved and signed.	
<b>188</b>	<b>MATTERS ARISING</b>  Mr D Phelps felt that Mr D Sproull, the Parish Councils solicitor, had written an excellent reply to Mr Lee's letter in Trio.  Mr D Phelps asked the clerk to read out an e-mail from Mr Fletcher dated 14/02/2013. The Clerk read out Mr Fletcher's e-mail.  Mr Fletcher informed the council that the verge outside Mayfield and Silvershell had been reseeded, but could do with being rolled.  Mr Bell informed the council he had spoken to the CPRE and they are sending the clerk copies of 'How to Shape the Area where you live'. It can also be downloaded.  The clerk informed the council that the posters for the Trelights meeting had been done. Mr Coles reported that he had set up an Excel spread sheet to record questionnaire data.	
	<b>PUBLIC DISCUSSION</b>  Mr A Penny informed the council that he was at the meeting to hear where the cars were going to park between now and the 4 <sup>th</sup> July. He understood that item 13 had been withdrawn. He felt that the council should delay work on the car park until after the summer. He was concerned that the council was losing its main income. He was also concerned that out of eleven councillors only one Councillor had come up with an alternative parking solution. He felt that the Council needed to come up with an alternative parking solution at this meeting.  Mrs M Dingle informed the Council that she disagreed with any form of parking on the Playing field. She felt that the Children's Play area needed to be protected. She also reminded the council that dog owners would not be able to park on the playing field as it has a Dog Control Order in place, therefore dog owners are banned from being on the playing field. She told the council that she had to go to Lobber to Play as a Child and she did not want to see that happen to this generation of children or any further children.  Mrs Bell informed the council that she was prepared to run a Car park on the playing field over the Easter Holidays and donate the money to the Playing Field committee.  Clerk to check if our Insurance would cover this activity.	

	<p>Luke informed the Council that he had a licence to run a park and ride scheme. Mr D Bolton felt that the Council should wait until the Autumn to carry out work on the car park, and run it in its temporary form over the summer.</p>	
<b>189</b>	<p><b>FINANCE</b></p> <p>a) It was resolved that the financial statement be approved subject to the payment to Ed Crossley Associates being postponed till April once it has been checked and verified. Cheques for other payments were signed.</p>	
<b>190</b>	<p><b>APPLICATIONS AND NOTICES</b> PA13/00745 Change of use from A1 (retail ) to A3 (restaurant/café). 18 New Road, Port Isaac, Cornwall, PL29 3SB. Fore Investments. Case Officer: Julie Mitchell Mr D Philp and Mr M Bell declared interests and left the room. <b>It was proposed by Mrs J Townsend that the Parish Council object to this application on the grounds</b> that there are already 13 restaurants in the village, 5 Cafes within yards of this premises, it will be the loss of another retail premises. The Parish council is also concerned that the historic empty petrol tanks were never removed from under this building, and the building sits on the road with no pavement. <b>This was seconded by Mr D Phelps and carried nem.con.</b></p> <p><b><u>Approvals &amp; Refusals</u></b> PA12/11749 Listed building consent for re-roofing of dwelling and detached shed. Cornwall Council approved this application.</p> <p>PA12/10584 Listed building consent for works and repairs to roof and repaint external walls. Mr R Cornish, Creighton Cottage, 64 Fore Street, Port Isaac, PL29 3RE. Cornwall Council approved this application.</p> <p>PA12/10940 Installation of a 6.7m high wooden BT Pole. Open Reach, Land Rear of 1 Silvershell View, Port Isaac. Prior approval not required.</p>	
<b>191</b>	<p><b>CORNWALL COUNCILLORS REPORT</b></p> <p>Mr Gisbourne urged the council to arrange alternative parking before the Easter Holidays.</p> <p>Mr Gisbourne informed the Parish Council that Cornwall Council had agreed a 0% increase on Council tax, which would hit some front line services.</p> <p>Mr Gisbourne informed the council that everything was coming to an end at Cornwall Council in the lead up to the elections. Mr Gisbourne reported on Mr Colin Brewers resignation from Cornwall Council in the light of his comment two years ago.</p>	
<b>192</b>	<p><b>CHAIRMAN'S REPORT</b></p> <p>Mr Harris turned his chairman's report over to discussions about possible alternative parking whilst work is being done on the car park. Mrs Bell volunteered to run a car park on the hard standing parking area attached to the playing field which would hold approximately 30 cars. Various other locations were discussed, it was agreed that the following Councillors would approach land owners. Mr Harris agreed to approach Mr Roger Richards. Mr M Coles agreed to approach Mr Barry Cleave. Mr M Bell agreed to approach Mr Kenny Richards, the Harbour Commissioners and Mr Taylor who owns the Headland Hotel. Mrs Townsend agreed to approach the Music Festival regarding use of their field at St Endellion. It was agreed that once a suitable piece of land was found the council would need to hold an extraordinary meeting. Mr Fletcher informed the Council if it was running a Park and Ride Service it would need a PCV licence which would take 6 weeks.</p>	
<b>193</b>	<p><b>COMMITTEE REPORTS</b></p> <p>Mr David Phelps informed the council that he had asked Mr Dave Dingle to cut the cemetery prior to Trevor Grylls Funeral. The Clerk reported that there are slates on the outside of the cemetery by the road. The Chairman agreed to move them somewhere safe.</p> <p>Mr M Bell reported that the clerk had received an e-mail from James Hodges informing her that they would be on site</p>	

	<p>tomorrow and taking possession of the site.</p> <p>Mr Fletcher informed the council had had 2000 daffodils bulbs in his shed which the school had not planted this year. He will keep them in his shed until he moves or they can be planted.</p>	
<b>194</b>	<p><b>FOOTPATHS</b></p> <p>It was proposed by Mr R Manders that the Parish Council examine and, if necessary amend the Draft Trimming Schedule. This was seconded by Mr D Phelps and carried. nem.con. It was agreed that the schedule would be amended to include The Main. The Clerk was asked to advertise in the Cornish Guardian for Tenders.</p>	
<b>195</b>	<p><b>TEMPORARY CAR PARKING</b></p> <p>It was proposed by Mr E Fletcher that the Parish Council uses the area behind the football pitch as an emergency temporary car park until the new car park is completed. Mr Fletcher withdrew this item on the grounds that it is not feasible due to timescale, cost, continued delays, local objections. He felt alternative parking needed to be found.</p>	
<b>196</b>	<p><b>PUBLIC TOILET MEETING WITH BERT BISCOE</b></p> <p>It was proposed by Mr D Philp that the Parish Council formalises an agenda for their meeting with Bert Biscoe On Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> March 2013 at 1pm to discuss the public toilets and decides where to meet him. This was seconded by Mr M Bell and carried nem.con. Clerk to book Church Rooms for meeting. Mr Gisbourne asked if the meeting could be change to 2pm as he was at a meeting in Truro. Councillors to e-mail clerk questions for the meeting.</p>	
<b>197</b>	<p><b>GULLGUARDS</b></p> <p>It was proposed by Mr D Philp that the Parish Council purchases 4 replacement Gull Guard Bags at the cost price of £50 in total. This was seconded by Mr E Fletcher and carried nem.con.</p>	
<b>198</b>	<p><b>CLERK'S CORRESPONDENCE</b></p> <p>a) <b>The clerk informed the Council that she had received the Cornwall Local Plan, Councillors could look at it online, and we could decide if we wish to comment at the next meeting.</b></p> <p>b) <b>The Clerk informed the Council that she had received notification that election and nomination forms would be available from the 13<sup>th</sup> March 2013. Mr Dawe agreed to pick them up from Wadebridge Council offices</b></p>
