	DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST	
43	<p>MATTERS ARISING</p> <p>Mr D Philp asked if the Parish Council had seen copies of the Insurance for Friends of the School event to be held on Sunday.</p> <p>Miss N Williams informed the Parish Council she had written a report for Trio asking for volunteers to help with the Neighbourhood Plan.</p> <p>Mr R Dawe informed he council that the grass at the bottom of the car park and playing field had been cut. He also informed the council he had rehung a gate in the playing field.</p>	Clerk to obtain copy of insurance and risk assessment.
44	<p>PUBLIC DISCUSSION</p> <p>Mr A Cameron from Clean Earth informed the Parish Council that there would be a public consultation for Application PA13/04287 on Tuesday 9th July at St Endellion Hall between 3-8pm. He informed the Council that the application had moved more quickly than they had thought it would and that is why the public consultation had not been carried out before.</p> <p>Mr Marcus Diamond informed the council that their Caravan Park overlooks the site of Application PA13/04287, he felt that it was preferable to a Wind turbine, however still had his reservations, as the site was larger than his Holiday park. It is the biggest site in Cornwall to date, it is on land adjoining the AONB, he is concerned that on the plans the AONB is fogged out. He was concerned that the drainage needed to be carefully considered, as the ground underneath will have no direct sun light.</p> <p>He was concerned about the loss of good agricultural ground.</p> <p>He also felt that better photographs were required to see the full effect.</p> <p>He also felt that the Parish Council should ask for the following Planning stipulations:-</p> <p>That if the permission is granted the feed in tariff should stay in Cornwall, profits should not be allowed to go overseas.</p> <p>The work should be carried out between October and March, so that we do not have a huge foray of work during the peak season.</p> <p>Mr Paul Diamond informed the council that he was also here to hear the decision regarding Application PA13/04287, but did not know enough to add anymore.</p> <p>Mr B Gisbourne informed the Parish Council that he was concerned about the loss of agricultural land caused by application PA13/04287. He informed the council that wheat is currently being grown in one of the fields.</p> <p>Mrs Emma Hamley, Mr T Bourne and Mr E Harris informed the council that they were at the meeting to hear the discussion on Application PA13/04287.</p> <p>Mr Kevin Griffin informed the council that his property was in direct facing view of site of proposed Application PA13/04287, he raised the following objections to the applications:-</p> <p>He felt it was the wrong area for an Industrial development in an unspoilt valley.</p> <p>He felt that the area was too large and the size should at least be reduced.</p> <p>He was concerned about the loss of agricultural land and the effect it would have on his outlook.</p> <p>Mr Mark Symons from Trevathan Farm, a neighbouring property, was also</p>	

	<p>concerned about the Industrial effect Application PA13/04287 would have on an unspoilt valley. He informed the council that there is a well walked footpath running through the valley and a large solar development would spoil the area for tourists.</p> <p>Mr Symons informed the Council that the owners of Tolraggott Bungalow were also concerned about Application PA13/04287, it would be in direct view of their property.</p> <p>Mr & Mrs Corbally also raised concerns over Application PA13/04287, they felt the area needed to be protected and were concerned on the impact on tourism.</p> <p>Mrs Penny Kirkman was concerned about the impact on St Endellion Church and that a Heritage survey had not been carried out.</p> <p>Mr A Cameron informed the Council that the income from the Solar Panel would be staying in Cornwall.</p> <p>He agreed to hold a site meeting.</p> <p>Mr Bell informed Mr Cameron that the 9th July was after our next Parish Council meeting on the 8th July. Mr Cameron agreed to try and change the date of the consultation until the 8th July so that the Parish Council could comment on it.</p> <p>Mr Bell asked Mr Cameron if they had grid connection and if it would be over or under ground.</p> <p>Mr Cameron informed the Council that they have grid connection in place and it would all be underground.</p>

This was seconded by Mr A Penny and carried nem.com</p>	<p>D Rmayner Makes signs for Portaloos.</p> <p>Clerk to contact SW Loos and ask about upping cleans to 2 per week.</p> <p>To come back to July meeting for resolution.</p>
