PM02/2021	Minutes of the 2019 Parish Meeting – 25 th March 2019 AGREED as a true record.	
	Noted that no Parish Meeting had been held in 2020, due to the Covid19 lockdown.	
PM03/2021	St Endellion Parish Council – report by the Chair.	Cllr. Raynor
	We started last year in lock down with concerns as to how long it would last, and as a result we started virtual meetings.	
	I would like to thank all members for their cooperation in making the virtual meetings a success. The lock down unfortunately bought a lot of matters to a stand still, anything that involved the C.C. ground to a halt.	
	We asked highways two years ago to move the thirty MPH signs out to the edge of the village in Trelights. We are still waiting.	
	We also asked Highways to undertake a survey as to how we could slow down the traffic entering the village. Traffic Island, pedestrian crossing etc. After offering to pay for the survey we are still waiting.	
	Lock down came to an end in June and the invasion started. I estimate at the peak we had over a thousand cars a day entering the village without the daily delivery vans etc.	
	We have subsequently written to the police and highways stating that we expect over a thousand cars a day down the B3267 a twisty road without a pavement that many people walk down from Trelights to Port Isaac. So far the Police referred us to the C.C. We are waiting to hear from Highways.	
	We engaged the services of our CMS just before this year started for which I am very grateful. When lock down ended we had to open the	

Toilets with all Covid precautions which also included the Loos at Port Gaverne. This also involved banking some £8,000 of 20p's from the loos.

Clare was involved in helping set up the Farmers market together with the usual maintenance of the play area, football field, installing a new seat on the Main, a new seat for the cemetery, resurfacing of the hard standing, erection of signs and a new notice board. This is all in addition to the general care of the footpaths verges car park etc.

We now have a new tenant in the shop at New Road, who we hope will now be able to open as we emerge from lock down.

As this is our last meeting of the existing Council, I would like to thank you all for your continued support over the last four years. In particular those who are not standing for election again. Mike Coles deputy chair who has been of invaluable help to the Council and myself, and also Martin Bell both have been members for many years.
