



Pedestrian improvement scheme • **September 2023**

Port Isaac

As part of planned improvement works, a combination of traffic lights and road closures will be in place in Port Isaac from Monday 11 September. These works are being funded by St Endellion Parish Council with the approval of Cornwall Council.

To protect road users and give our workforce a safe working zone, we need to implement these traffic management arrangements.

Works will be undertaken between the hours of 8.00am and 5.00pm, Monday to Friday. Overnight surfacing work will be carried out between the hours of 7.00pm and 6.00am.

While the road closures are in place, access will be maintained for school buses and our marshals will be on site to support residents and businesses. All through traffic will need to follow the diversions at all times.

Please be assured we will make every effort to minimise the impact of our works and complete the scheme as quickly as we can.

Thank you for your cooperation and patience while these works take place.

What works are taking place?

Our work will involve the planned delivery of a highways footway scheme, to improve pedestrian safety. This includes widening of the carriageway to create new footways, installation of new crossing points, signage, and kerbing works.

We will also be carrying out overnight surfacing work. By increasing the scope of the highway schemes and combining them, we are making every effort to reduce the impact on the local and surrounding communities, removing the need for return visits.


The work will be carried out in phases to minimise disruption. The first phase will start near Back Hill, and progress to the second phase on New Road before moving onto Trewetha Lane.

We have programmed the works outside of the peak holiday season and aim to complete the works before the school half term, to minimise the impact on the local community.

Diversions

Signs will be placed at major junctions prior to the road closure on the key routes to take non through traffic away and keep traffic disruption to a minimum.

We appreciate they can sometimes be quite lengthy, but diversion routes must be suitable for the type of traffic that would normally use the route.





Access arrangements

Access for residents and business will be maintained through gateways managed by traffic management marshals. Residents will need to stop at the closure gateways and will be given safety instructions prior to entering the closure.

Emergency access will be maintained at all times.

Working safely

Please be aware of the following hazards while the work is taking place.

- Uneven road surface where the old surface has been removed
- Raised manholes, gullies, and other service boxes
- Varying kerb heights when stepping off the footway

Suitable barrier systems will be in place to safely separate pedestrians from hazards to provide a safe route around our works.

It is important road users follow any safety instructions and signage through our works to ensure the safety of those working on site and fellow road users.

Please be aware this information is correct at the time of circulation but is subject to change at short notice, especially in periods of poor weather.
